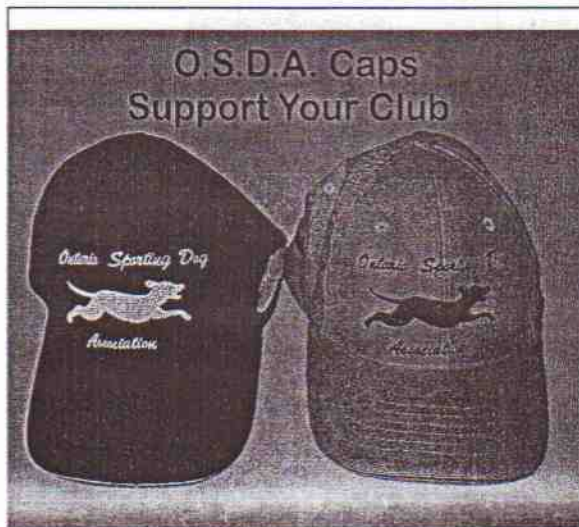
11.4 (1) An inspector or an agent of the Society may, without a warrant, enter and inspect any building or place used for animal exhibit, entertainment, boarding, hire or sale, either alone or accompanied by one or more veterinarians or other persons as he or she considers advisable, in order to determine whether the standards of care prescribed for the purpose of section 11.1 are being complied with.

## \*What Can DNA Testing Do For You?\*

When analyzed in the laboratory, a dog's DNA reveals a unique pattern—its DNA profile. DNA profiles allow a breeder to:

1. Establish a permanent record of identity for any dog.
2. Determine individual paternity for separately sired siblings.
3. Provide bitch owners with guaranteed stud service.
4. Verify artificial insemination.
5. Resolve breeding disputes.
6. Guarantee puppy buyers a solid pedigree.

\*Dual-Sired Litter.\* Breeders may breed their females to two sires during the same heat and register the subsequent litter using the following procedure. This procedure may not be used to register a litter where more than two sires were involved.

1. Both sires and the dam must be of the same breed, permanently registered with UKC, and DNA-Profiled through UKC.
2. All pups must be individually identified in some way. The easiest way to do this is to have each pup wear a different colored collar, but they may also be identified by coat color, sex, or other clear means of identification satisfactory to the UKC DNA

Program Manager.

3. The litter must be registered with UKC using the Dual-Sired Litter Registration Application. Each puppy must be given a name which correlates to the selected method of identification, e.g., Red Collar Female, Blue Collar Male.
4. All pups in the litter must be DNA profiled through UKC.

Upon receipt of the results of the DNA profiles, UKC will assign each puppy to the dam and the correct sire. All puppies in dual-sired litters will be DNA-VIP.

## Privately held uncoded ammunition to be destroyed by 2011

The bill that is being pushed in 18 states (including Illinois and Indiana) requires all ammunition to be encoded by the manufacturer in a data base of all ammunition sales. So they will know how much you buy and what calibers. Nobody can sell any ammunition after June 30, 2009 unless the ammunition is coded.

Any privately held uncoded ammunition must be destroyed by July 1, 2011. (Including hand loaded ammo.) They will also charge a .05 cent tax on every round so every box of ammo you buy will go up at least \$2.50 or more!

If they can deprive you of ammo they do not need to take your gun!

This legislation is currently pending in 18 states: Alabama, Arizona, California, Connecticut, Hawaii, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Washington.

## KAWARTHA HIGHLANDS SIGNATURE SITE PARK MANAGEMENT PLAN APPROVED

### *Backgrounder*

The Ontario government has approved the management plan for the Kawartha Highlands Signature Site Park, which provides specific direction to manage Ontario's largest provincial park south of Algonquin. The Kawartha Highlands Signature Site Park is a unique park with separate legislation that recognizes a range of traditional activities that are continuing.

The approved management plan recognizes that the protection of the ecological integrity of the park is the overriding priority in the management and administration of the park. This plan will preserve, protect and enhance the natural composition and abundance of native species, biological communities and ecological processes in the park.

Proposed changes to the hunting regulation in the park would allow for open season hunting for all species from September 1 to the Thursday before the Victoria Day weekend, with the exception of wolves and coyotes, which will be protected from hunting year-round. The proposal modifies traditional uses in the park by restricting some activities that took place before the park was established so that they do not occur during peak periods of activity by park visitors. There will be consultation on this proposal.

Management planning for the Kawartha Highlands Signature Site Park began during the summer of 2005. Management plans address topics such as zoning, resource management, operations, development and seasonal activities.

The Kawartha Highlands Signature Site Park Act, 2003, provided for the establishment of a Management Advisory Board to play a substantial role in management planning, working closely with Ontario Parks as an integral part of the planning team.

The Kawartha Highlands Signature Site Park is located 50 kilometres north of Peterborough, along the southern edge of the Canadian Shield. It features a rugged, rolling landscape of small lakes, wetlands, forests and rocky barrens.
